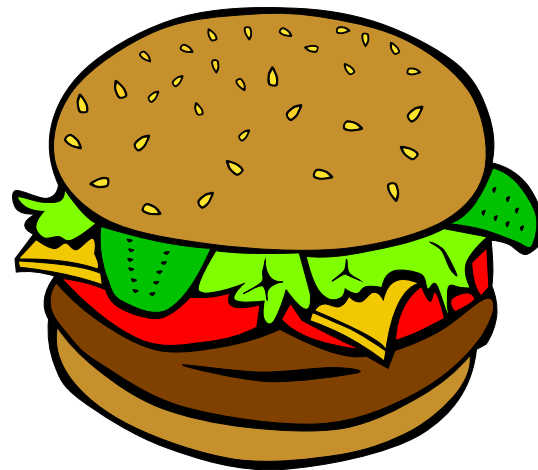

9. 🌬️ You can sometimes see your breath on a cold day because the warm air you breathe out turns into tiny water droplets.

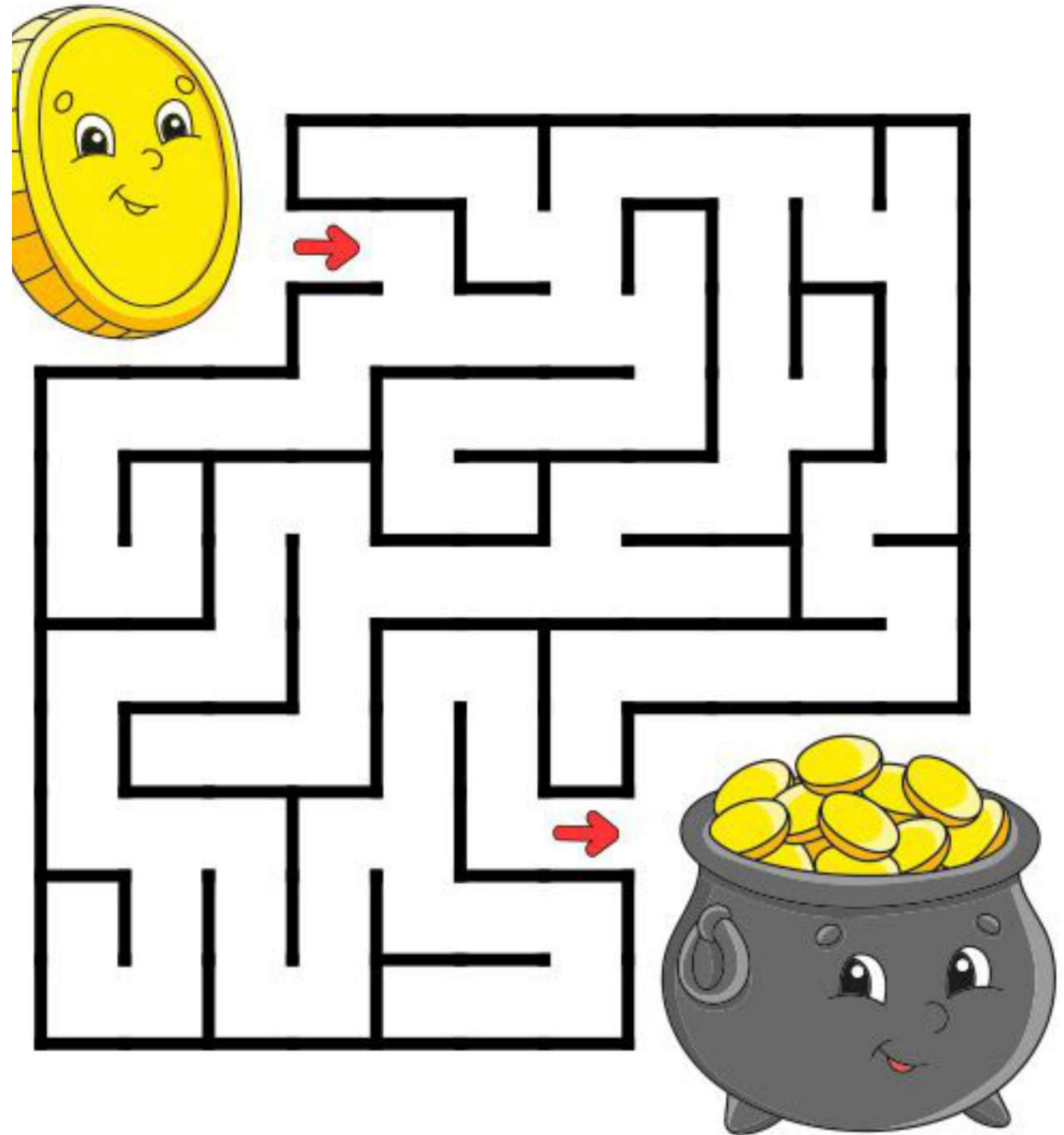
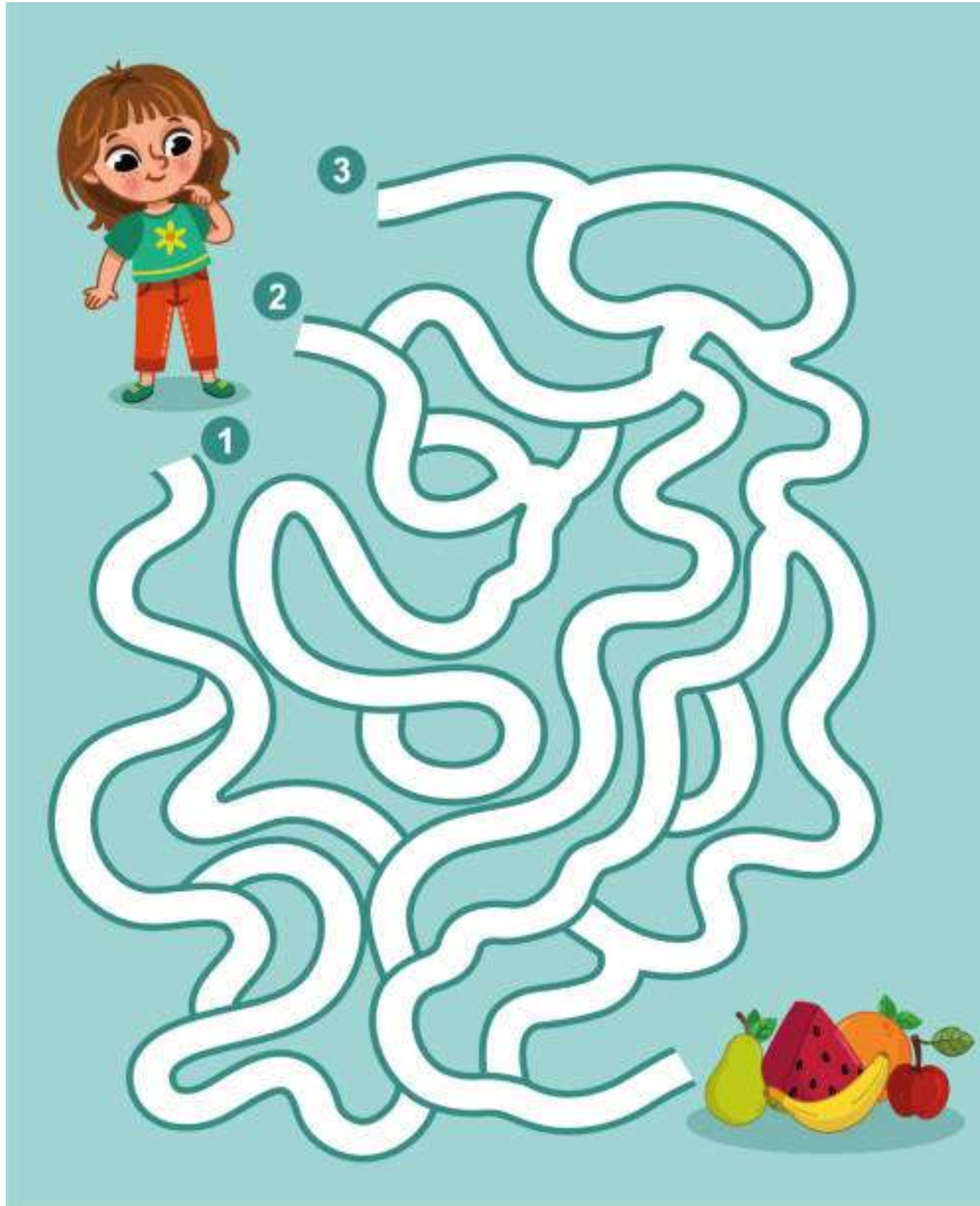
10. 🧤 The coldest temperature ever recorded on Earth was about -89°C in Antarctica!

Why Looking After School Stationery Can Pay Off

At the end of every school year, she asks her children to bring her all their remaining stationery. She then checks what is still in good, usable condition. This simple system teaches several important life skills:

In a world where many items are easily replaced, this mother has found a creative way to show her children that taking care of what they have can actually pay off.

🦒 A giraffe's tongue can be up to 50 cm long! It uses its tongue to grab leaves from tall trees.

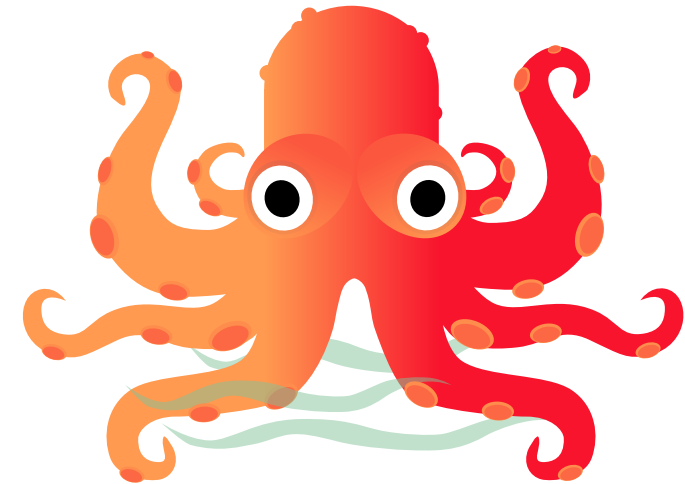
🍯 Honey never spoils. Archaeologists have found pots of honey in ancient tombs that were still safe to eat.
